

With the warm weather and barbeque season upon us I hope everyone is taking the time to relax with family and enjoy the summer.

Your college continues to stay busy and are working hard to advance the profession of opticianry in Saskatchewan and across the country. Amendments to the bylaws have been made and provisions added for prior learning assessments to assess the



skills of immigrants and others that wish to join the profession of opticianry. We are presently working with the NACOR and other regulatory bodies across the country to develop a national standard for assessments and are currently developing our own materials pertinent to our own *Act* and Regulations.

As everyone is aware by now, the college was successful in prosecuting an illegal contact lens dispenser and as a result, charges are currently in the process of being filed against another. We are also in the process of preparing for a push on illegal contact dispensing leading up to Halloween. A special prosecutor has been appointed by the Department of Justice to handle all prosecutions of the college, and because the college has limited resources, we are currently working with the prosecutor to develop a workable protocol for prosecutions across the province. As that develops enforcement action will increase.

The college is also pleased to announce the appointment of Paul Johnson as assistant Registrar. Paul will be working with the Register on all matters related to licensing and the regulations including, the prosecution of illegal dispensers.

HER MAJESTY THE QUEEN vs COSTUME EMPORIUM

On February 20th., 2014, members of the legislative group appeared in Provincial Court in Regina, Saskatchewan to argue charges laid against Costume Emporium for illegally dispensing contact lenses. Costume Emporium was convicted and a fined levied for \$1000 for a first offence, as a message to others illegally dispensing, that the court views the illegal dispensing of contacts as a serious matter.

The ruling also clarified our legislation and supported the colleges position that all contacts whether or not containing a prescription fall under the provisions of the *Opticians Act* and must therefore be dispensed by a qualified trained and licensed individual. The SCO took the Judges ruling one step further by amending the regulations to clarify even further that the dispensing of contact lenses of any kind are regulated by the college.

Paul also served on the council numerous times and, as president for several of those terms. Paul will be assisting the Registrar in all matters related to licensing and regulatory affairs including, the investigation and prosecution of illegal contact lenses dispensers.

In response to a complaint from a member, the SCO recently approached the SAO to ask that all disclaimers be removed from prescriptions issued.

CONTINUING EDUCATION CREDITS

The SCO office deals with lots of enquiries regarding continuing education credits. As a reminder, here is an explanation of how the continuing education system works.

Each year at renewals, we look at the credits you have accumulated over the previous three years. Credits should be submitted to the SCO office by fax, email or mail. For renewals next year March 2015, we remind everyone to have their credits up to date. Members cannot be licenced unless their credits are up to date. A statement of your continuing education credits is sent out twice a year, in February and August. You can now check your continuing education credits balance online. Further information on this new feature is available on Page 16.

Members are also reminded that seminars that are not SCO or NACOR approved require pre-approval from the SCO. The pre-approval process is relatively simple, and only requires that when a member makes a decision to attend a non sponsored event, the member contacts the SCO office in Saskatoon and provide a copy of the material for review. The College will review the material being offered at the event and pre-approve those seminars qualifying for education credits.

The member could also request that the sponsors of the event, forward their material directly to the college for review and approval prior to the member registering for the event. The college would be pleased to review the material being offered at the event and advise the sponsor which seminars can be approved for credits and the amount of credits to be awarded to each seminar.

Saskatchewan Association for Safe Workplaces in Health (SASWH) on Safety Talks in the Workplace Article by Sandra Cripps

The Saskatchewan Association for Safe Workplaces in Health (SASWH) is dedicated to the sustainability of workplace health and safety through education, support and consultation. Our commitment is to support the Saskatchewan Healthcare industry in the elimination of workplace illness and injury with a vision of workplace health and safety: a priority for all.

What is a Safety Talk?

It's a two to five minute "talk" on a safety related topic. It's a quick safety "huddle". A staff person can hold a safety talk so long as you are someone who is knowledgeable on the subject matter and can lead the Safety Talk. Consider having a Licensed Optician speak about the benefit and necessity of eye protection in the workplace, or the necessity of an eye wash station in the workplace. It's important that everyone attend because safety is everyone's responsibility.

Safety Talks are one way to remind workers and reinforce choosing safety first. They are part of an effective safety management system. Safety Talk topics can be chosen based on the identified need and repeated at various times throughout the day, week, month or year. Safety Talks should take place at the beginning of the work schedule to heighten safety awareness throughout the shift/work day. Consider posting the Safety Talk in a visible place and make reference to the topic throughout the shift. "Catch" and acknowledge people working safe and making safe choices - a positive reinforcement.

The use of Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) is a legislative requirement and is one example of a good safety talk to hold with your co-workers. The use and provision of PPE is known to most employers and the workplace safety message below is just one example of how SASWH can provide additional resources to our members in creating a more effective safety talk.

Note: Effective July 1, 2014 in Saskatchewan, the Ministry of Labour Relations and Workplace Safety and the Ministry of Justice have created what is called "Summary Offence Tickets" (SOT). The following definition is taken from the Government website stating that: "A Summary Offence Ticket is a ticket issued by one of two designated Occupational Health Officers and is directed toward

employers, contractors, owners, self employed persons and suppliers." It is interesting to note that there is one offence that will apply to all workers:clear failure to use personal protective equipment (PPE) that has been provided by ones employer. Before ticketing a worker, officers will assess if the worker was provided with the correct PPE, received adequate training on its use, and was clearly directed to use the PPE but chose not to. STUDENT LICENCE INFORMATION

All students must register each academic year with the SCO for a student optician or student contact lens practitioner licence. The fees are \$30 annually and there is also a \$10 once off registration fee for first time applicants. A passport photo must also be submitted for your student card. Registration forms are available from the SCO office.
