It turns out that was the summer I actually set eyes on my husband to be, whom I met later the next year. It goes on and on . . . what are your summertime memories?

### FROM THE REGISTRAR'S DESK

As your registrar and member of your legislative committee I am pleased to provide the membership an update on where we are with your new legislation and bylaws.



The Act has been passed by the legislature finally and once the bylaws are completed and approved by the Minister, the Act can be proclaimed. Therefore, we are moving forward with the developing and drafting of the "Regulatory Bylaws" as quickly as possible. Since the bylaws will set out exactly how the new "Opticians Act" is to be administered, its very important that we get it right the first time.

Since the new Act contains, numerous changes and additions, so too then, will the Regulatory Bylaws. There is for example, a new and exciting addition to the bylaws that we believe will boost & add to the professionalism of the membership and that is the "Letters of Designation Restriction". This section will allow and restrict, only to members in good standing, certain letters of designation that may be placed after their name. Practicing opticians will be able to place the letters LO beside their name and contact lens practitioners will be able to place LCLP beside their name. Members practicing in both disciplines may add LO, LCLP.

As well, the bylaws will set out clearly an optician's allowable scope of practice and of course the limitations to that practice as well. These are just a couple of changes that will be included in the bylaws that once completed and approved by the Minister, will set out the guidelines for the membership to follow for a very professional practice.

So far, we have met twice with the Ministry and they have indicated that they are very pleased with what they have seen and the progress to date. The goal is to have the bylaws completed and in place by September and we will continue to work as hard as we can to try and make that happen.

Its always a pleasure to be able to speak to the membership through **The Eye Opener** and provide information and updates from time to time but, if anyone has any questions or would like further information on the *Act* or Bylaws or any other matter, I would encourage you to please call or email the Saskatoon office and Stephanie will have the appropriate person get in touch with you.

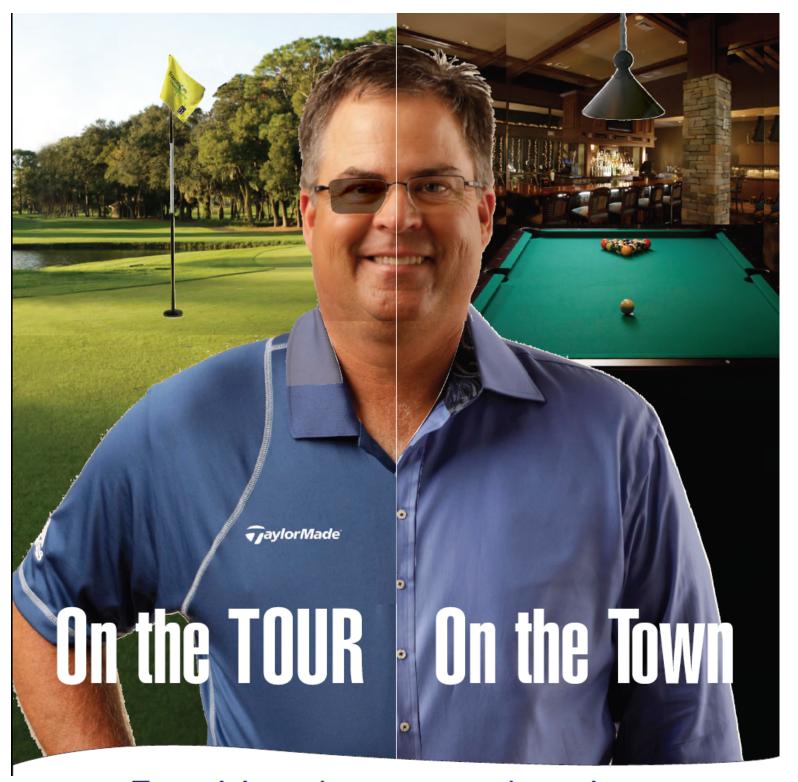

### Theft of five ophthalmic frames from OPTIKA on June 4<sup>th</sup>, 2010.

A couple came in during the busy hours of the afternoon, the male (30ish) approximately 5'10" tall and very thick in build (not fat) but solidly built. He had a great deal of tattoos on his arms, legs and going up onto his neck, some tribal in design. His head was shaved, with a pair of Oakley sunglasses perched on top. He had dark eyes and had a sparkly stud just below his bottom lip and he wore high end athletic gear.

His female companion, I think she was in her late twenties or early thirties, was of First Nations or Métis descent and very pretty. She was approximately 5'8" tall and wore glasses with a fairly substantial Rx, I think it may have been a D&G frame of some sort. She has dark brown eyes and curly hair to the middle of her back. She was slender but not thin and was wearing high end yoga type clothing.

I hope these descriptions will help other shops avoid having thefts of this size and cost. The police have been informed of the theft, a report has been filed and as I understand it, the couple are exceptionally well known in the Broadway area as professional shoplifters. They have managed to steal from almost every shop in the Broadway area.

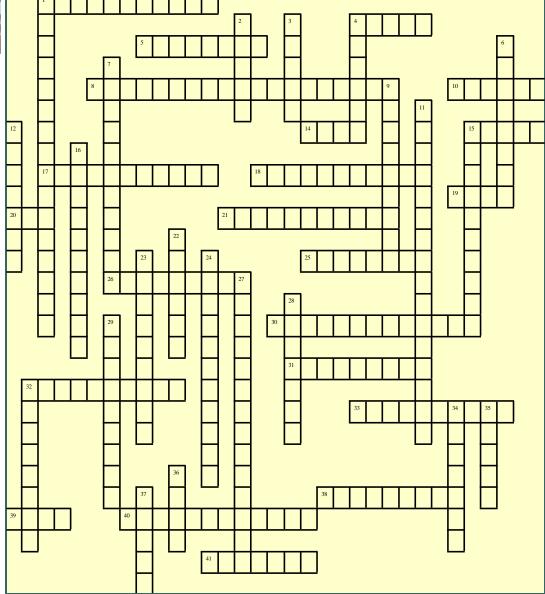

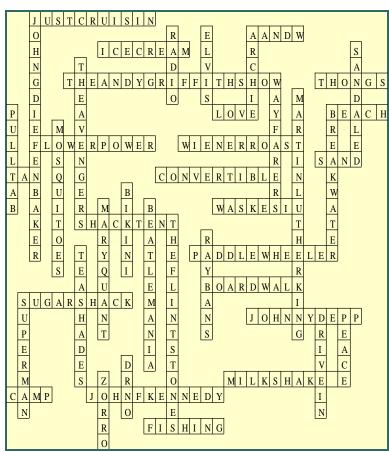
